**Goal:** To support deprived, excluded, orphaned and vulnerable children in Murang'a South and their families to meet their own needs.

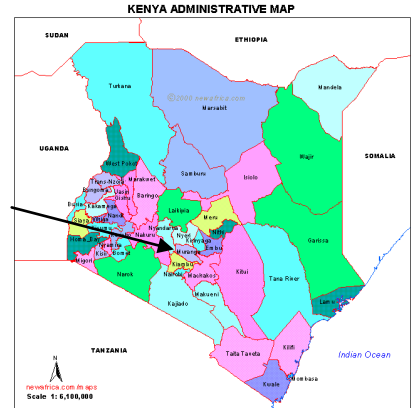

**Healthy and Secure infants**

**Project 1: ECD** 51(M16,F35) CHV trained on level one strategy.

- 38 caregivers (Male 19, Female 19) trained on the importance of early childhood development
- 33 ECD centers supported with child friendly play materials
- 4 Monitoring visit to ECD centers & 1 ECD renovated.



**Project 2: HEALTH and Nutrition**

- 2352 children (Male 1176 Female 1176) growth monitored.
- 41,11children (Male 2055 Female 2056) supported with VIT A & De-wormers. 56(M 27,F 29) children with illnesses treated.
- 3656 children (Male 1629,Female 2027) supported malezi bora.
